## Corrections Health Services provides 24/7 medical and mental health care.

- -Operates five medical clinics
- -22,131 patients treated annually
- -18,334 mental health exams
- -3,171 dental exams
- -881 outside consults
- -8,793 medications dispensed daily




## Staffing

- -42 RNs
- -51 LPNs
- -14 Licensed Mental Health Specialist
- -5 Dental
- -6 Pharmacy
- -4 Case managers




## **National Commission on Correctional Health Care**

## Screening and Treatment Pathway

#### Triage

- Every patient is screened upon entering the facility
- Patient's needing urgent care are sent to the ED for medical clearance
  - Unstable vital signs
  - Ill-appearing patient who is not alert, oriented to person, place and time
- Patient's who are suicidal and/or exhibiting abnormal behavior are placed in Safe Book
  - Safe Book is a designated area in booking for patients in psychosis or suicidal crisis, we provide close medical observation, care and frequent evaluations by our psych team until stabilization.

# Screening and Treatment Pathway

#### Intake Screening

- current medical concerns and treatment history
- current medications (Surescripts)
- infectious disease symptoms
- substance use disorder and mental health history
- dental concerns
- Prison Rape Elimination Act (Zero tolerance sexual abuse or harassment)

#### Intake Referrals

 Appropriate medical, substance use disorder and mental health referrals are made based on screening.

# Screening and Treatment Pathway

#### Physical Assessment

- A Detailed medical assessment must be conducted within 14 days of booking
- Usually conducted within 10 days
- In-depth exam that builds on information provided in triage
- TB test
- Scheduled for chronic clinics or other appropriate care
- Repeated on an annual basis if patient is still incarcerated



#### Mental health care

- -43% of the jail population has diagnosed mental health condition
- -3.7% of the 43% have an acutely mental illness
- Onsite Licensed Mental Health Specialists provide 24/7 coverage
  - Group
  - Referral
  - Crisis intervention



### Psychiatric care

- Psychiatric services are provided onsite through staff and telepsych
- -Contract for seven crisis stabilization unit (CSU) beds
  - High acuity patient's who cannot be stabilized in the jail
- More patients are arriving on injectable mental health medications, raising pharmacy costs



### Chronic care clinic

- –Focused on providing care to patient with ongoing medical conditions such as:
  - HIV
  - Asthma/COPD
  - Diabetes
  - Seizure disorder
  - Hypertension
  - **TB**
  - Sickle cell disease



- OB Services:
  - Routine OB visits
  - Laboratory and diagnostic testing
  - High-risk prenatal care
  - Management of the substance use disorder in a pregnant patient
  - Comprehensive counseling
  - Recommended vaccines
  - Appropriate nutrition
  - Postpartum follow-up
  - Lactation



#### Detox Unit

- In July 2023 centralized unit was created for patient going through withdrawal
- 8,590 patient were treated in 2024.
- Continually monitored using withdrawal scales.
- Are treated with medications specific for their withdrawal.
- Patients requiring closer medical supervision are housed in the infirmary or transferred to a local hospital.



#### Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)

**–Onsite clinic operated by contractor - March 2022** 

- 70 patients are seen on a daily average
- 416 patients were treated in 2024
- 213 newly inducted patients in 2024

-896 Narcan kits placed in property last year



### HIV prevention/care services

- -Free HIV testing is offered 7 days a week.
  - 7,504 tests last year.
- -Case manager enrolls HIV+ patient into Ryan White and ADAP programs that provide free medical, support, and pharmacy services.
- ADAP allows patient to receive free antiretroviral (ART) medication while in jail.
- Discharge planning conducted for newly diagnosed patient for follow-up medical care and case management appointments.



## Congenital syphilis prevention program (2023)

- In response to the CDC call to action to reduce infants born with syphilis
- -Rapid syphilis testing is offered 7 days a week
- -5,680 patient tested
- -192 new cases identified
- -Appropriate treatment started at jail
- -DOH is notified of new cases to provide appropriate follow-up once patient are released



### New Services that will be instituted this year.

- -Tele OB: Provide tele OB services to pregnant females through a FQHC and appropriate follow-up once inmate is released.
- Hepatitis C: Provides free Hepatitis C testing and medication through a partnership with an outside vendor. Will also provide appropriate follow-up once inmate is released.



#### Post-Release Community Resources:

- County clinic, women's health, VA
- HIV continuing care
- Aspire
- Addiction help
- Shelters
- Support groups

Patients currently on medication are referred to the county pharmacy for 30 days of free medication.
